I would love to sit in his presence and listen to his latest reflections on the theology and daily experience of the Holy Spirit.

In his book *Lord God Holy Spirit Sanctifier*, he wrote: "Once a soul not only believes but actually experiences the guidance and the protection of the Holy Spirit, that soul will vigorously explore how to become more deeply united with God's indwelling presence."

While these words were written as a catechesis of the Holy Spirit and prayer, they were profoundly autobiographical.

That is the gift and inspiration that Bishop Edward Cullen gave to me and to so many of us. As we pray for his soul, let us ask the Holy Spirit to give us the spiritual depth that he always encouraged us to pursue.
